

We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft lights or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but it is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be an inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totally open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we received one other report of a 'UFO' sighting for the 4 September 2008, and that was from Guildford in Surrey. We are satisfied that there is no corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached by unauthorised aircraft.

Finally, with regard to there being any low flying military aircraft in the area, I enquired, and have been informed that there was a Tornado in the vicinity at 21.00 at 250 ft, but that was only there for one minute as it flew by, on the way to RAF Marham.

Just got into the hot tub to relax and looking at the stars and clouds, Suddenly I spotted something moving in the sky. It was at an altitude of approximately 500 feet heading in a north /north east direction at about 30-40 miles an hour (slower than a light aircraft). best way to describe the shape would be a chewing gum pack that was about 150 feet long 50 feet wide and about the same in height. It came right over where I was and passed over my house It was black in colour and had 3 circles of lights/ exhausts underneath it emitting a dull orange light, similar to embers in a fire. I could see it quite clearly as it was visible by the ambient light and the cloud that was above it. It made no noise whatsoever and the only variation to the shape was a slight ridge around where the lights/ exhausts were. The lights were spread out the length of the object similar to traffic lights, one in the center and the others at about 10 feet from each end the diameter of the lights were all the same at approximately 30 feet, leaving 10 feet on each edge.





As I came down the hill I saw people stopping to look at the sky. Further down a couple were stopped and were pointing at the sky to the East. I saw three very low, very bright lights travelling in formation then breaking off and doing acrobatics seen in sky over Canterbury. The lights were distant (probably a couple of miles) but large globe-like, travelling very fast and then coming to an almost immediate stop, changing direction in an instant, and changing colour in a pulsating way (not the flashing lights of a plane or helicopter), ranging through bright white light through red, green, blue, and orange. The incident was so strange I pulled the car over in the St Stephens Road area (just before the railway crossing) as dozens of people had come out of their houses and were pointing and staring at the sky. One commented that "they flew really low over our house and then shot off really fast, a few miles in a second".

I watched them for a few more minutes as they again reformed into a formation and travelled East towards Sturry / Broad Oak. One broke off and headed rapidly back towards my position before stopping and following the others. I jumped in my car and drove onto the Broad Oak Road to follow them, but could not see them in the sky any more. I did see some bright red lights stationary on the hill above the Broad Oak Road but could not ascertain what they were in the dark (I know there are pylons there so although unusually bright they could have been the hazard warning lights on those).

East of Canterbury is Manston International Airport, but this is not a usual flightpath and most significantly these lights were accompanied by no sound (indeed I could say they seemed to be accompanied by a silent stillness).

They looked and behaved like no plane or helicopter I have seen.

Were there any low flying military flights in this area at this time? Were any objects detected on radar in the area at this time.

If not, can you register my concerns over what I saw?






