I am writing with reference to your e.mail dated 16 July 2008, regarding your two UFO sightings on the 12 and 13 July 2008.

As stated before, in previous correspondence, the Ministry of Defence has no interest or role in respect to 'UFO/flying saucer' matters, or to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms about which it remains open-minded. The date, however, the MOD is unaware of any evidence that proves that these phenomena exist.

Unless there is corroborating evidence to suggest that the UK's airspace may have been compromised by unauthorised aircraft, the MOD does not investigate or seek to provide a precise explanation for the UFO sighting reports we receive each year.
