My wife and I have recently witnessed six UFO's on the night of Tuesday 10th 11:30pm, until approximately 3:00am on Wednesday 11th June.

One of the bright lights may be explained away as being a planetary body or satellite. I am writing with reference to your report of an 'unidentified flying object', seen on 11 May 2008 the details of which you e.mailed to the MOD. This office is the focal point within the Ministry of Defence for correspondence relating to 'UFOs.'

First, it may be helpful if I explain that the Ministry of Defence examines any reports c 'unidentified flying objects' it receives solely to establish whether what was seen might have som defence significance; namely, whether there is any evidence that the United Kingdom's airspac might have been compromised by hostile or unauthorised air activity.

Unless there is evidence of a potential threat to the United Kingdom from an external source, and to date no 'UFO' report has revealed such evidence, we do not attempt to identify the precise nature of each sighting reported to us. We believe that rational explanations, such as aircraft light or natural phenomena, could be found for them if resources were diverted for this purpose, but is not the function of the MOD to provide this kind of aerial identification service. It would be a inappropriate use of defence resources if we were to do so.

The MOD does not have any expertise or role in respect of 'UFO/flying saucer' matters to the question of the existence or otherwise of extraterrestrial life forms, about which it remains totall open-minded. I should add that to date, the MOD knows of no evidence which substantiates the existence of these alleged phenomena.

With regard to your particular observation, I can confirm that we received no other reports o 'UFO' sightings for 11 May 2008 from anywhere in the UK. We are satisfied that there is n corroborating evidence to suggest that the United Kingdom's airspace was breached b unauthorised aircraft.
