The case of the murder of Daria Dugina was transferred to the central office of the Investigative Committee

The investigation believes that the crime was custom-made

Chairman of the Investigative Committee of the Russian Federation **Alexander Bastrykin** instructed to transfer the criminal case on the murder of **Daria Dugina** to the central office of the Investigative Committee, the department <u>said</u>. Earlier, the prosecutor's office of the Moscow region put the progress and results of the investigation of the criminal case under control.

The investigation believes that the **crime was pre-planned and is custom-made**. The department also said that an improvised explosive device was planted under the bottom of Darya Dugina's car on the driver's side.

"Examinations are being appointed, including biological, genetic, physical-chemical, explosive forensic examinations, a video recording from the car's DVR was seized, an order was sent to operational services to identify the persons who committed the crime and other witnesses of the incident," the department noted.

Daria Dugina, daughter of Russian public figure **Alexander Dugin**, <u>died</u> at night in the suburbs - she was returning in a jeep from the literary and musical festival in Zakharovo. Musician **Peter Lundstrem** said that her father was supposed to be in the car in which Daria died.

Alexander Dugin gave a lecture at the festival, and his daughter was also present. Daria was blown up in a car near the village of Bolshie Vyazma on Mozhayskoye Highway, she was driving for about ten minutes. According to the head of the DPR, **Denis Pushilin**, "terrorists of the Ukrainian regime" were involved in the explosion. SC opened a criminal case under paragraph "e" of Part 2 of Article 105 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation (Murder committed in a generally dangerous way). Earlier, Readovka wrote that Moscow was planning two more terrorist attacks by the Armed Forces of Ukraine, which were prevented.
