Transmitted herewith is the AERODYNAMIC/CARTHAGES Progress

Report, for your further distribution.

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Subject: REDSOX/ATRODYNAMIC - Progress Report

1. On or about 5 February 1952, CARTHAGES 15 and 16 were removed from the "Area B" Landsberg, to a new safehouse in Kempten, where they lived with until 26 February.
2. On 8 February both new men were given the CARRIAGE test in Kempten by The results of these tests indicate that there are no discrenible security factors prohibiting the operational use of these men. On 10 February was rushed to the hospital for an appendent only so that the full test results could not be written up until he returned to duty. They are as of this date on their way to Headquarters. (See MGAA-307)
3. On or about 13 February 1952,
from their safehouse in Kempten to the main CARTHAGE safehouse in Kaufbeuren, where they have been living to date with CARTHAGE 310, 12 and 13. CARTHAGE 3, whose fluctuating morale and wounded pride worked a bit of a wet blanket on CARTHAGE 10, 12 and 13, was taken out of the Kaufbeuren safehouse and put into the Kampten safehouse on the same day that the new men were moved out. It was not felt desirable for morale of all concerned to have him live in the same house with 10, 12, 13, 15 and 16, although he will continue to give occasional classroom lectures on the MVD-MCB, partisen tactics, etc., to the entire team.  CARTHAGE 3.is a good lecturer and CARTHAGES 10, 12 and 13 still respect his missingness and oratory even if they cannot respect him as leader after his missingless and oratory even if they cannot respect him as leader after his missingless information regarding their dispatch be kept from CARTHAGE 3 and any other CARTHAGES who remain behind
had in fact, begun his usual list of pre-d-day physical complaints. The same thing happened in Spring 1951, when he thought he was about to jump into the homeland. Although the disease is "parachutaphobia", the symptoms are misleading. For instance, on 3 March CARTHAGE 13 complained of a pain in the back of his neck which, he explained, would probably go away if "some blood could be transfused from my leg to my neck."

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It was furthermore agreed that if CASSOWARY 3 posed the \$64.00 question he would be informed that the delay had been caused by the German government, which was still insisting that all Guard Companies on German soil after 1 April 1952, be subject to incorporation into the German army. This answer represents enough of the truth if not the whole truth. It was, in other words, agreed that the Germans would be made the goats as far as any blame is concerned.

7. By 3 March when the new men had been with the old men for about five days, the differences in past experience between the older CARTHAGE "partisans" and the new CARTHAGE fledglings who had had no partisan experience at all. The new CARTHAGES have an awful lot to learn and the older CARTHAGES are already expressing their displeasure that some of the partisans from the emigration were not recruited instead of two "telyatky". (The fact of the matter is that none of the Landsberg "partisan" types felt like volunteering: each said he had had his share of the disconforts and dangers of partisan life - would like to wait until war breaks out before returning to the homeland). It is too early to say what effect this discrepancy in experience between the older and the newer men will have on the operation.



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
