Interviews with Belo-Russians and Ukrainians in the U.K.

1. When _ was dest in Lordon, he informed me that he had discussed with
SMASH the necessary arrangements for having a WillalM representative interview
Belo-Russian and Ukrainians in the U.K. with the view of selecting qualified
individuals for operational employment.
that Broadway was unable to agree to putting out representative in direct touch
with prospective employees but that Brownnay would conduct interviews with selected
individuals in our behalf. Texpressed the opinion that this arrangement
would not be satisfactory since direct personal appraisal of the cardidates was
essential prior to accepting them for our work. I further informed me that
SMASH had agreed to put the Broadway position in writing.

2. theler date of 13 August 1952, I received a letter from Broadway confirming the conversation which [] had had with SMASH. Shortly after the receipt of this note, I had a talk with SMASH during which I expressed surprise at the Broadway position in view of existing arrangements which we have with JACKMT for direct contact with individuals in the W.K. after clearance with JACKHOT. I ou**tlined to** SMASH in some detail what these arrangements with JACKRU comprised and he agreed that such arrangements appeared entirely reasonable and that he would personally support such a procedure in regard to Russians whose we wish to see in the U.K. Shortly after our convergation, SHASH left London on holiday. Muon SHEDDIN returned to his deak, I raised this question with him. He was informed regarding it and I believe that SMASH probably left a note for SMEDDOM on the subject prior to SMASN's departure. SMEDDE informed as that our request for personal contact with Mussians was a reasonable one and that broadway really could see no objection to the arrangement which we had requested. However, SMEDDOM stated that he could not approve this request until the entire matter of Dyclaim contact with individuals in the U.K. had been discussed and clarified. He stated that DYCIAVEER was at propent in touch with meserous people in the W.K. for a variety of purposes; that these activities case to the attention of Broadway indirectly through reports from the police and reports from individuals who suspooted certain activities in which representatives of DYCLATING were engaged. Supply told me that he had discussed this general problem with Martin II. Lyden and that he hoped in the imadiate future to be able to come to we agreement which hereafter would control such activities by OYCLAIM in the U.K. When these broad arrangements are agreed, WEDDUN indicated that Jewett's request for direct contact with Russians in the D.K. would be in order.

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3. It is requested that Headquarters approve a comprehensive discussion with Broadway of the problem of contact by MICLAIN representatives with individuals in the U.K. and operations which DYCLAIN is currently conducting in the U.K. It is proposed that after discussing this nation with \(\) we together pursue the matter with the appropriate Broadway officers.

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
