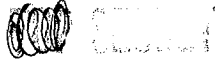

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PROJECT AERODYNAMIC

FY 1955 Renewal



1. Objective

The purpose of Project AERODYNAMIC is to provide for the exploitation and expansion of the anti-Soviet Ukrainian resistance movement for cold war and hot war purposes. Such groups as the Ukrainian Supreme Council of Liberation (UHVR), its military adjunct, the Ukrainian Insurgent Army (UPA), the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists (OUN), all in the Ukraine, the Foreign Representation of the Supreme Council of Liberation (ZPUHVR) in Western Europe and the United States, and other Ukrainian organizations such as the Foreign Section of the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalists (ZCHOUN) etc, will be utilized.

2. Origin and Policy Guidance

a. Origin

- (1) Memorandum to CPP dated 25 January 1950, Subject: "Use of Ukrainian Partisan Movement Against U.S.S.R." (TS No. 35998)
- (2) Project approval by ADPC 17 June 1950 (TS No. 38901)
- (3) U.S.S.R. NSC 10/2/5 Country Program approved in principle by DCI, 30 January 1953 (TS No. 88049) superseded by NSC 5412
- (4) U.S.S.R. Country Program FY 1954, approved in principle by PRG, 19 August 1953.

b. The project was originated in the field.

3. Situation

a) To date, the project has been successful and has produced results. The large amount of material brought out of the Ukraine in 1950 has been of informational and operational value. The newspaper "Suchasna Ukraina" published by the ZP UHVR under the project subsidy has been a successful endeavor in presenting to its readers news considered favorable to the United States. The Soviet Study Group has produced works of value and plans have been formulated which will further the PP mission in the Ukrainian SSR and to solidify the assets of the Ukrainian Underground.

b) The latest directives (1953) from the underground headquarters recognize the ZPUHVR as the only representative organization officially recognized by the underground for:

- (1) Negotiations with foreign powers.
- (2) Coordination of activities in support of "homeland" resistance (training, contact and dispatch of agents etc.).

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The ZChOUN, at the present time collaborating operationally with JAVELIN, has been ordered to reorganize in accordance with the latest "Homeland" Mandate. This reorganization has been rejected by the leader of ZChOUN but accepted by a number of ZChOUN members who, through an appointed "Duo" will attempt to reorganize as directed. This split within the ZChOUN will undoubtedly revive the issue of joint CIA-NIS operations directed at the exploitation of the Ukrainian Resistance Movement.

c) The subsidized Ukrainian newspaper Suchasna Ukraina has established a high reputation within the Ukrainian emigration. It can be stated that the newspaper is a decided success and that CIA should continue to subsidize it.

d) A Soviet Study Group, under the auspices of the ZPUHVE, has been organized for the purpose of supplying CIA with political, economic, biographic and sociological information on the Ukrainian SSR and the Communist leadership and to furnish plans for Headquarters utilization in the fulfillment of the U.S. Intelligence and Psychological warfare missions. Two studies have already been received and are presently being reviewed by SE/PP staff.

e) Certain individuals within the above Study Group are also being utilized in preparing radio scripts for clandestine broadcasts, specifically tailored to the needs of the target audience (Ukrainian SSR) on a close and friendly basis, which will augment the existing inadequate PRPAIME and KUBARK efforts. During FY 1954 the radio program had been approved and operated as a sub-project (ASBANTER) of Project AERODYNAMIC and necessitated separate funding and administration. In order to operate more efficiently and with less confusion the activities under ASBANTER are being incorporated in Project AERODYNAMIC for Fiscal Year 1955.

4. Proposal

It is proposed that Project AERODYNAMIC be renewed for fiscal Year 1955 in order to continue the purchase of services and subsidy of the above mentioned organizations to achieve the aforementioned objectives of this project.

5. Operational Outline

a) Sub proposals or "tasks"

(1) To render financial assistance to the ZPUHVE for fulfilling its role as the only representative organization officially recognized by the Ukrainian Resistance inside the Ukraine as its spokesman abroad.

(2) To develop covert capabilities for sabotage, guerrilla warfare, etc., in support of U.S. hot war objectives.

(3) To maintain adequate communications between the Resistance Movement in the Ukraine and CIA.

(4) To establish operational support facilities in the Ukraine with the aid of the Resistance Movement.

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- (5) To develop evasion and escape networks for wartime use.
- (6) To train personnel in the proper techniques and methods to be used in political and psychological warfare against the Soviet regime both in cold and hot war situations.
- (7) To continue supporting the Soviet Study Group, under the auspices of ZPUHR, for the purpose of supplying CIA with information on the Ukrainian SSR and the Communist leadership as well as to prepare propaganda materials in support of the U.S. Psychological Warfare objective.
- (8) To continue material and financial assistance to the underground for the preparation and distribution of psychological warfare pamphlets, leaflets, etc., in the Ukraine whenever operational conditions warrant such activities.
- (9) To continue subsidizing the Ukrainian language newspaper Suchasna Ukraina as an additional tool in our attempt to unify the major Ukrainian groups as an instrument for anti-Soviet propaganda.
- (10) To utilize broadcast time available on the ZUPARK radio installation PYREX at Athens, Greece, for broadcasting programs directed to Soviet officials, Soviet military forces stationed in the Ukraine, the civilian population and the underground movement including the Ukrainian Insurgent Army.

b) Key personnel

(Note: Attention is directed to the fact that although the personnel listed below are designated to be connected with the FP functions of the Project, some are also engaged in FI activities as well due to the nature of the Project. Those falling into this category are: CASSOWARIES 2, 3, 4, 6, 15.)

CASSOWARY 2 - Foreign Minister of the Ukrainian Supreme Council of Liberation (UHVR). Consultant on FI and FP matters, resides in the U.S.

CASSOWARY 3 - Second vice-president of the Ukrainian Supreme Council of Liberation (UHVR). Consultant on FI and FP matters, resides in Germany.

CASSOWARY 15 - Principal Agent and Covert Associate residing in the U.S. Acts as courier, cut-out and assistant on operational and FP matters for CASSOWARY 1.

CASSOWARY 4 - UPA representative and Principal agent residing in the U.S. Acts as Operational and Training Officer for the ZPUHR.

CASSOWARY 6 - Principal agent residing in Germany. He is CASSOWARY 3's assistant. Duties involved following: jump-master, operations officer, paymaster etc.

CASSOWARY 17, 18, 19, 20 and 21 members of Soviet Study Group. Each is utilized in the preparation of studies on the Ukrainian SSR and radio scripts for broadcast into the Ukraine SSR. Each individual is a

university graduate and holds a Masters degree in his specialty field e.g., Economics, Agriculture, Philology, Literature, etc.

CASSOWARY 22 - Translator for material and radio scripts produced by the Study Group. Holds Masters degree in Economics and presently studying Law at St John's University.

c) Indigenous groups and or leaders

ZPUHVR (Foreign Representation of the Ukrainian Supreme Council of Liberation) Directly involved. Leaders are CASSOWARY 2 and 3.

ZChOUN (Foreign Section of the Organization of Ukrainian Nationalist) Leaders are CAVATINA 1, CAVATINA 16 and CASSOWARY 9.

UHR (Ukrainian Supreme Council of Liberation) Location in Ukrainian SSR and is directly involved. Leader is CAMPCORE 5

UPA (Ukrainian Insurgent Army) Located in Ukrainian SSR and is directly involved. Leader is CAMPCORE 5.

OUN (Organization of Ukrainian Nationalist) Located in Ukrainian SSR and is directly involved. Leader or leaders unknown.

d) Target Groups

Primary target groups are those mentioned in paragraph 5-C.

e) Duration

This project will be continuing subject to renewal at the beginning of each fiscal year.

f) Not applicable.

6. Security

a. Cover

Study Group - A backstopped field cover has been established through cover Division, a reputable firm of long standing is being used as the ostensible lessee of the office space procured.

Staff - PP field personnel in Germany operate under Department of the Army civilian cover and represent themselves to the members of the resistance movement there as being the American Intelligence Service.

Agents - The members of the ZPUHVR are known as members of that organization. The cover of agents being infiltrated into the Ukraine will vary with operational circumstances and requirements.

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b. Knowledgeability - Only the few leading members of the organization are knowledgeable of U.S. intelligence interest. The members of the Study Group are unwitting at the present time of U.S. interest but upon initiation of the black radio program and obtainment of covert clearances they will be informed of U.S. Government not U.S. Intelligence interest. BLS is knowledgeable of our operational interest in the EPUNVR.

c. Operational Security

In providing financial support for the activities envisaged in this project, and particularly for that portion involving subsidy of Ukrainian emigre personnel or organizations, the field personnel will advise their Ukrainian emigre contacts that the funds are being supplied by various private sources in the U.S. who are interested in the Ukrainian National Movement. The radio broadcasts will be attributed to a national group of Ukrainian anti-communists. There will be no connection, actual or implied with any established Ukrainian emigre group. Since the broadcast tapes will be recorded in the United States and then flown to Athens, no physical security problems are envisaged in Athens. The existing New York office of the study group will serve as an office for preparing the scripts. This increased activity is not expected to cause any undue interest in the cover organization. The actual recording process will be limited to persons involved in this portion of the radio program (announcers and technician) and will be accomplished in premises other than the Study Group office.

d. Risks

No extraordinary risks involved other than those inherent in all operations of this type. Every effort will be made to keep this risk at a minimum.

e.. Personnel disposal

To date there have been no extraordinary disposal problems.

f. Disaster Plan

a. Chief of Mission in Germany will make all necessary arrangements for evacuation of key agent and political personnel to safe places in Western Europe or the Western Hemisphere.

b. Arrangements will be made to destroy or evacuate all classified material or other evidence concurring American interest in the Ukrainian organization.

c. If possible, less important agent personnel will be left behind.

g. Coordination

a. Relation with other projects

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Although AERODYNAMIC is sharing the facilities of PYREX, this project will in no way conflict with actions already undertaken by other projects in Athens.

b. Coordination

Liason with the Air Force to determine the feasibility of air drops as needed and coordinate training program of crew, procurement of and servicing the aircraft, dry run flight, etc.

Other departments and agencies of the United States such as State Department, Department of the Army, etc. At no time will this coordination compromise precise operational timetables, exact locations, or identities of agent personnel.

8. Control

a. Headquarters for control and operational direction will be in Washington, where coordination of all activities outlined in the project will be centralized.

Field control of the radio program will be exercised indirectly through an Office of Communication representative in Athens. [has been able to monitor and evaluate its other language broadcasts by defector reports.]

b. Administrative Plan

An Administrative Plan for AERODYNAMIC Project was completed and approved 2 September 1953.

c. Reports

No unusual reports procedures involved.

9. Budget Data

a. Total over all CIA funds required for Fiscal Year 1955 \$99,500.00 (Financial breakdown attached).

d. Foreign currency

When necessary to supply foreign currency in support of our PP efforts the currency is obtained from Finance Division, Office of the Comptroller.

e. Funding

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The ZPUHVR organization will be held accountable for all American funds which may be put at their disposal in accordance with established reporting requirements and procedures.

As outlined in AERODYNAMIC Administration Plan (approved 2 September 1953), the Field Case Officer will transmit subsidy funds to a representative of ZPUHVR, who shall receipt for the funds. The receipt will show date, payer, and the amount of funds received.

f. Financial History

On 30 January 1953 the DCI authorized the renewal of the AERODYNAMIC/PP project and approved in principle the sum of [] for Fiscal Year 1953. Funds obligated during FY 1953 totaled []. Obligations total for FY 1953 does not indicate the true expenditure picture due to faulty reporting of PP expenditures by the field.

For Fiscal Year 1954 the sum of [] was approved in Principle by PRG 19 August 1953. This budget was revised and reduced to [] in January 1954. It is estimated that FY 1954 expenditures for PP operations will total [].

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Existing facilities in Athens, Greece, will be utilized for the broadcasting. The transmitters have a total power output of 2000watts. The stations will have an audible radius of 1,300 miles under optimum conditions. No extraordinary requirements or facilities over those mentioned herein will be required.

d. Other CIA Support: Not applicable

e. Support required from other United States agencies.

Support will be furnished by all branches of the Government which supply raw information through normal channels to KUEARK. As necessary, classified information which has been reattributed and sterilized, will be cleared with the appropriate agency or department for use in propaganda programs.

11. General Considerations

a. Current status

PP operations are now being conducted under Project Aerodynamic.

b. Commitments

During successful W/T contact with the underground headquarters in 1951 we committed American support of full technical aid to UHVR thru ZPUHVR. Also political support consistent with U.S. policy of self-determination.

c. Effectiveness

Successful contact has been established with the Resistance leadership during 1951 and continued with the exception of the regular winter cut-off season through 1952 and 1953. A good working relationship with the ZPUHVR has been established and greater effort is now being exerted in the Political and Psychological field. The Soviet Study Group is currently supplying CIA with political and economic information on the Ukrainian SSR and biographic information on the Communist Party in the Ukrainian SSR. The CIA supported ZPUHVR organ, Suchasna Ukraina, has continued to maintain a high journalistic reputation within the Ukrainian emigration. Recently the Soviet Study Group has been given the additional task of producing radio scripts in the Ukrainian language for broadcasting into the Ukrainian SSR. The plan for the radio program as submitted by the Study Group received favorable comments.

d. Anticipated results

It is anticipated that with proper support and guidance from SR/PP staff, the ZPUHVR will be able to expand clandestine resistance and psychological warfare activities in the Ukrainian SSR.

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This project is partly based on the need to make a more significant propoganda impact on this strategic target area. The presentation of clandestine broadcasts specifically tailored to the needs of the target audience delivered on a close friendly basis, will augment the existing inadequate PEPRIME and KUMARK efforts. Thus a psychological climate can be fostered which will be more favorable to the conduct of SR operations in the Soviet Ukraine. The studies produced by the Soviet Study Group will supply CIA with information on the Ukraine SSR and the Communist leadership which will be used in the fulfillment of the U.S. Intelligence and Psychological warfare missions.

e. Evaluation

The activities undertaken within Project AERODYNAMIC will be continually reviewed and appraised by Headquarters and the Field PP and FI case officers to ensure the continual accomplishments of the Project objectives.
