SYNOPSIS:

SUBJECT neighborhood continues to be a good middle income, residential development. Most of the front yards on the side of the street of SUBJECT premises are heavily shrubbed during the warm months. Some of the neighbors make it a habit to sit in their front yards. Because of this practice frequent visits by visitors to SUBJECT premises may arouse curiosity. There are no apparent changes in communications systems, fire and police protection and possible security hazards. There are no additional exhibits. Information on new persons residing near the premises is set forth.

DESCRIPTION OF AREA:

On visiting SUBJECT area it was noticed that many of the deciduous plants and shrubs were in bloom and had their leaves. Many of the homes, especially those on the side of the street of SUBJECT house, were heavily shrubbed with some plants that were more than 6' tall. It was also observed that during the periods of the day some of the older folk living in the neighborhood would sit in their front yards on aluminum folding chairs brought to the sidewalk. In the auto-way behind SUBJECT house there was a 4' x 4' metal water drain that had caved in about 12".

This dangerous condition which was behind house 144-29 69th Road, indicated that the auto-way could not support trucks or heavy traffic. There were other broken sections of the auto-way noted. While walking through the auto-way which is used to reach the garages of the houses facing on 69th Road as well as on 69th Avenue, several dogs who were in fenced-in back yards barked for a short time (See Exhibit A).

DESCRIPTION OF SITE:

No changes were noticed.

COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEMS:

No apparent changes were made. The bus that runs along Jewel Avenue is Q65A which can be had at the 70th Avenue exit of the 71st Avenue Independent Subway Station. The bus that runs along Main Street is Q44. This connects with the IRT Flushing Line.

FIRE AND POLICE PROTECTION:

No changes were noticed.

POSSIBLE SECURITY HAZARDS:

The practice of sitting in front of some of the houses by some of the neighbors may arouse curiosity if frequent visits are made by strangers to SUBJECT premises. The keeping of dogs in the rear yards may be an asset in alerting the people that there is someone in the driveway. At the same time it may be hazardous to try to admit someone through the rear of SUBJECT premises without alerting others nearby.

OUTLINE OF EXHIBITS:

No additional exhibits have been added.

BIOGRAPHICAL DATA:

Examination of Spring 1956 street directory published by the New York Telephone Company for the borough of Queens showed that a ROBERT H. GLICKER (BO 8-8528) is listed at 114-06. It is to be noted that this building had previously been listed as being occupied by ~~IDA POLLACK~~. The directory showed that LOUIS CURTI (BO 8-8823) was residing at 114-08; previously, the only other person reported as being there was ~~GLADYS CURTI~~.

The directory stated that JOSEPH LA PLACA (BO 8-8173) was listed for 114-10.

The directory further showed that EMMA B. HUEPPI (BO 3-2736) was at 114-11. This house is not only on the same side of the street as SUBJECT house but is also contiguous to it. It had previously been reported that ~~AUGUST HUEPPI~~ was an occupant of this house.

Lastly the directory listed IRVING JAFFEE (LI 4-3502) as being at 114-13. All of these homes are on 69th Road. 114-12 had been previously reported as being occupied by ~~ALFRED AND MARY VASSALLO~~. An examination of registration records for the year 1955 showed no record on either the new or the old occupants of buildings 114-06, 114-08, 114-10, 114-11 and 114-12 69th Road.

The files of the Bureau of Special Service & Investigation, New York City Police Department, 400 Broome Street, were examined in the names of ~~LOUIS CURTI, ROBERT H. GLICKER, EMMA B. HUEPPI, IRVING JAFFEE and JOSEPH LA PLACA~~ with negative results.

LOUIS CURTI - no credit record

ROBERT H. GLICKER - credit report stated he has been in the files of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York since 9/30/53 and his address was 114-06 69th Road, Flushing. His place of employment was Oasis Service Station, 63-15 Freshpond Road, Bklyn. The report stated that his credit record was favorable and there were no judgments against him.

EMMA B. HUEPPI - a credit report described her as a widow and said she has been on record since June 1948. At that time she was 47 years of age and was the widow of AUGUST G. HUEPPI. She has a grown son ARTHUR, and another, AUGUST, who are in their 20's. The report added that she has been living at 114-11 since August 1942 and that the present market value of the house is \$10,000. Previously she had lived at 801 Seneca Ave., Ridgewood, Long Island for 1½ years. She is employed by Gordon Textile Co., 141 West 17th St., N. Y. C. as a weaver for 8 or 9 years. Her son, AUGUST is employed by E. F. Hager and Sons, 9802- 217th Lane, Queens Village, L. I. as a machinist. There was no litigation in file.

IRVING JAFFEE - there is no credit record. Telephone company records indicate that a telephone was charged out to him at 114-12 69th Road in July 1946. At that time he was partner of a bar and grill, 3601 Church Ave., Bklyn.

JOSEPH LA PLACA - he has no credit report, but N. Y. telephone company records indicate that a telephone was charged out to him at 114-10 69th Road in 1946 and that at that time he was employed by the Boston Fish Corp.
