On 1 Aug 1970 there took place at the home of Oleh, FEDYSHYN of New York, N.Y. a meeting between Hlib Mykolayevych DSVETKOV, Vice-Rector of Kiev University and Ivan KHMIL, Soviet employee at the UN in New York City, on the one hand, and the host; Vsevolod Holubnychy of New York City, Ivan Koropetsky and Myroslav Labunka of Philadelphia, Pa, and Iwan Lysiak-Rudnytsky of Washington, D.C., on the other. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss an eventual establishment of contact between Ukrainian Soviet scholars and lecturers in Kiev and their colleagues in the USA. It was agreed that those present at the meeting Ukrainian Americans will make a suggestion in this respect to the Kiev State University and the latter in its turn will invite them to the Soviet Ukraine where they would mit, and lecture to, their Soviet collegues . The details are to be discussed by Ivan Lysiak-Rudnytsky during his visit to Kiev in Aug 1970. Lysiak-Rudnytsky is taking part at the Historica Congress in Moscow from 14 to 23 Aug 1970 and on this occasion will also visit Kiev and Lvov. On his way back he will stop in Prague to see Dr Orest Zilynsky and his other friends in the Czeck capital.

According to our Sources, TSVETKOV made a very good impression as a businesslike and reasonable man. He seemed to be very interested in the project.

Roman <u>SERBYN</u> of Universite du Quebec, Montreal, Department of History is taking part in the Moscow Historical Congress toognHeowEllvbe"in Moscow from 14 to 24 Aug 1970, and then from 24 to 27 in Leningrad, and from 27 Aug to 4 Sept in Kiev. From Kiev he goes to Lvov where he will stay until 10 Sept. He is authorized by the Dept of his University to establish a preliminary contact between the Dept of Histoire of the Quebec Universite and its counterpart of Kiev University.
